The Institute of Chartered Accountants of the Caribbean (ICAC) was established on October 28, 1988, bringing together accountants within the English-speaking Caribbean. The founding members of the ICAC were Bahamas, Barbados, Belize, Guyana, Jamaica, St. Lucia, and Trinidad & Tobago.

Since its establishment, the ICAC has provided a forum for the advancement of the accountancy profession in the Caribbean. Today, with seven member bodies (national accounting institutes) and a network of approximately 3,700 accountancy professionals, the ICAC is the recognised accountancy grouping for the Caribbean dedicated to advancing the interest of accountants within the Caribbean through the promotion of internationally acceptable standards and best practices, thought leadership, research and continuing professional development. The ICAC is a recognised "Acknowledged Accountancy Grouping" of the International Federation of Accountants (IFAC). This is a designation held by only five other accountancy groupings in the world. These groupings support the objectives of IFAC and the advancement of the accountancy profession within their jurisdictions.

Annual Caribbean Conference of Accountants

Through its flagship event, the Annual Caribbean Conference of Accountants, the ICAC provides a forum for accountants in the region to participate for mutual and fraternal benefits while examining regulatory issues and other developments impacting the profession globally. The 34th Annual Caribbean Conference will be held in Belize City, Belize over the period June 23–25, 2016. The conference will be hosted by the Institute of Chartered Accountants of Belize (ICA-Belize) and will be held at the Ramada Princess Hotel and Casino.

Mike Hathorn

IFAC Board Member

Mike Hathorn joined the IFAC Board in November 2013, nominated by the Chartered Institute of Public Finance and Accountancy and the Institute of Chartered Accountants of Scotland (ICAS). Mr. Hathorn was appointed chief operating officer for Moore Stephens International Limited in July 2013, with responsibility for global network development. He was previously a partner with Moore Stephens LLP, London, for 10 years during which time he led the firm's UK public sector audit and assurance team. He continues to provide public sector consultancy services and is a member of the UK Treasury's Whole of Government Financial Reporting Advisory Group.

Mr. Hathorn is chairman of the Moore Stephens International and Moore Stephens Europe Technical Committees. He was previously a partner with Moore Stephens Scotland from 1974 to 2003, managing partner from 1989 to 2002, and chairman of Moore Stephens UK from 1989 to 2004. Mr. Hathorn is also a past president of ICAS, where he has served on the Council and various committees over the past 30 years. Mr. Hathorn previously served as a member of the International Public Sector Accounting Standards Board (IPSASB) for 10 years, including as vice chair from 2004 to 2006 and chair from 2007 to 2009. He has presented papers at many international conferences during and since his three years as chair of the IPSASB and continues to contribute to the development of accrual accounting and the adoption of International Public Sector Accounting Standards (IPSAS) in the public sector.

Alexandra Chin qualified as an ACCA member in 1986 and she has been a member of ACCA's Council since 2005. Prior to her election to Council, Alexandra was an International Assembly Member representing Malaysia (2003 to 2005). She was also President of ACCA Sabah from 1999 to 2005. Alexandra has been Chairlady of ACCA's Qualifications Committee and is currently a member of ACCA's Nominating committee. Besides ACCA, Alexandra has also been actively involved in various professional bodies and community organisations in Sabah. These include the Malaysian Institute of Accountants (Sabah Branch) and the Chartered Tax Institute of Malaysia (CTIM) Sabah Branch. She has served as a member of the Board of Trustees of Sabah Park and as a Board Member of Sabah Sports Board.

Lisa is also the Vice-Chair of the recently formed Barbados Chapter of CPA Canada (the body formed on the merger of the 3 legacy professional accounting associations in Canada) and is the Chairman of the Membership Committee of the Institute of Chartered Accountants of the Caribbean (ICAC).

Over the last 17 years, Lisa has been actively involved in the integration of the Caribbean practice of EY through her role as the Caribbean partner responsible for Learning & Development, and was the Audit Methodology Leader for the Caribbean practice since inception until December 2014, Lisa was the Vice-President Finance and Administration of the Barbados Chamber of Commerce and Industry (BCCI) from 2004 – 2008. Her provocative and no-holds-bar style brings a fresh perspective to the myths, prejudices and mindsets around these macro trends and she challenges leaders and their companies to forsake their past orthodoxies and biases that prohibit them from tapping into the largest and most profitable target markets in the world.

Photo Journalist and Keynote Speaker

Tony Rath has lived a life of adventure, exploration and documentation of nature in far off worlds. Beginning as a young man with the exploration of Canada's boundary waters, his passion and curiosity has lead him to service in United States Air Force, work as a marine biologist, captaining a sailboat across the Atlantic (twice) and through the Mediterranean and North Sea, and commercial fishing north of the Arctic Circle. He is an editorial/commercial photographer, but is best known as a photojournalist. His photography is on display at the Smithsonian Institution and recently featured in the Minnesota Science Museum's award wining traveling Maya exhibit. His images have been published in 100's of magazines and books. He has lived in Belize since 1988 and has passionately and extensively documented the natural environment and culture of his adopted country, above and below water.

He volunteers his skills and donates imagery to numerous non-governmental organizations to promote culture and conservation. In 2015 he presented one of the first TEDx Talks in Belize. 

Belize is located in Central America and it is bordered to the north by Mexico, to the south and west by Guatemala and to the east by the Caribbean Sea. We are a diverse country with various cultures and languages. We also have the lowest population density in Central America with 35 people per square mile or 14 people per square kilometer. Belize is also known for its extreme biodiversity and distinctive ecosystems. On the coast, there is a swampy coastal plain with mangrove swamps. In the south and interior there are hills and low mountains. Most of our land is undeveloped and is forested with hardwoods. It is a part of the Mesoamerican biodiversity hotspot and it has many jungles, wildlife reserves, a large variety of different species of flora and fauna and the largest cave system in Central America. Some species of Belize's flora and fauna include the black orchid, the mahogany tree, the toucan and tapirs.

Numerous ruins indicate that for hundreds of years Belize was heavily populated by the Mayans, whose relative advanced civilization peaked between A.D. 250 and 900. Eventually the civilization declined, leaving behind small groups whose offspring still inhabit certain areas of Belize contributing positively to the culturally diverse population. The Climate is subtropic with prevailing wind from the Caribbean Sea. The annual temperature averages 84 degrees F. Humidity is also fairly consistent at around 85 percent. As a diverse community, Belizeans are always showcasing their cultural, historical and local pride through annual festivities! It's safe to say, no matter which month you arrive there's something happening! From foodie festivals like chocolate festival, lobster festivals, to cultural celebrations like Don Juan Carnaval, Belize's diversity is vibrant and enticing!

TRAVEL TIPS

The ICAC 34th Annual Caribbean Conference Planning Committee wishes you an enjoyable stay. As with any trip away from home, you are advised to take the necessary precautions to make your experience a truly memorable one. Please keep in mind the following general safety suggestions:

- Comply with all laws and respect local customs.
- Avoid hitchhiking and/or picking up hitchhikers.
- Remain alert, trust your instincts and pay attention to your surroundings. Report any suspicious activities to the police.
- Avoid leaving bags, cameras and valuables unattended.
- Avoid carrying/displaying large amounts of cash and expensive jewelry and placing cameras round your necks. Avoid leaving similar items in full view in your vehicle.
- Use appropriate banks for all foreign exchange transactions.
- Should your passport, credit card or travellers cheques be lost or stolen, report it immediately to the police and your banking agent. Call 911 for the nearest police station.
- Avoid excessive consumption of alcohol.
- Travel with someone else or in groups.
- Only stay in recommended hotels.
- Ensure your tour operator has a valid tour guide license.

WHAT YOU SHOULD KNOW

Official Language: English Currency: Belize Dollars (BZD

Climate: The average temperature is about 30 degrees Celcius (89 degrees Fahrenheit).

Banking & Business: Banks are open Monday to Thursday, 8am-2pm and Friday, 8am-4pm. Banks are located throughout the city. Most government departments and private businesses are opened from 8am to 5pm. Shops open from 8am-9pm from Monday to Saturday.

Taxes: Hotel Tax: This tax of 9 percent is standard to all hotels and guesthouses in Belize.

General Sales Tax: Referred to as GST, this is a 12.5 percent tax added to goods and services. The prices displayed in stores usually include this tax, unless otherwise stated. Companies registered to charge GST must prominently display their Certificate of Registration.

Telecommunications: The international dialling code for Belize is 1-501 followed by seven digits. On the islands, use the seven digits only. Cellular Service: With two cellular phone service providers in BTL- Digicell and SMART. Both providers offer mobile roaming services and pay-as-you-go mobile services.

Driving in Belize

Driving in Belize is an adventure that may test you, depending on where you're heading. You can rent a car at the Belize International Airport. Several car rental companies can be found right in the parking lot of the airport. Be sure to get a map of Belize and directions from your hotel to wherever you are going. Know that no matter how good the directions may seem, there will probably be a fair amount of guessing and hoping that you are on the correct road. Just look at it as part of the adventure, because it is. While there are signs directing you from town to town, the signs are few and far between and you may go several miles wondering if you are still on the right track. Again, the journey is part of the destination. If you're renting a car, be sure to get a sturdy 4x4 as the roads here are bumpy. We also advise that you only drive during the day...finding yourself on a very dark, very bumpy, very long and twisty road during the night is not a good idea. Also, you'll notice speed bumps and lots of them. We use speed bumps as opposed to stoplights in many areas. You really have to slow down when approaching them. There are three paved highways running through Belize that can get you where you need to go. They are: the Phillip Goldson Highway, which runs between the Mexican border and Belize City; the George Price Highway, running between. Belize City to the border of Guatemala; and the Hummingbird Highway which leads to southern Belize.

Frequently Asked Questions

Q: How do I get to the Conference Hotel from the Airport?

A: The 34th Annual Conference Planning Committee provides complimentary transfers from the airport on all arrival and departure days commencing on June 21 to June 28, 2016. You may also rent a car from auto rental agencies situated at the airport. The hotels also provide shuttles to and from the airport for a fee.

Q: What is the acceptable rate for tipping?

A: This is left to your own discretion; however, you can follow the guidelines below:

Taxi Drivers: 10% of the fare / Service Staff at a Restaurant: 10 to 15 % of total bill / Spa Attendants: 10% of total bill.

Q: What type of clothing should I pack?

A: For business days, suits, shirts, ties, blazers and jackets, skirt suits and dresses are appropriate. For day trips, comfortable, light clothing is recommended,

Q: Can I use foreign currency to pay for goods and services?

A: US dollars are widely accepted throughout Belize.


